312	Application to review a Premises Licence - Premier Convenience Store, 57 Hylton Terrace, Bedlinog	The Committee were advised of an e-mail received from Mr S Panchal, who is an agent of Mrs Patel (the new licence owner of the Bedlinog Stores) requesting an adjournment. He outlined that he would be unable to attend today due to personal commitments and also this would also allow sufficient preparation time for the new owner and himself to prepare for this meeting.

313	<p>Application to review a Premises Licence - Pantyscallog Inn, Pantyscallog Terrace, Merthyr Tydfil</p>	<p><u>In attendance:</u> Mr Ken Brewer (Owner) Mrs Tanya Dudley (Licensee) Mr Donnison (Solicitor)</p> <p>The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting and outlined the procedure.</p> <p>Amy Gould, the Council's Licensing Officer, led the Committee through the report. She advised that since the publication of the agenda, additional information had been received from the Environmental Health Officer which was e-mailed to Mr Brewer prior to today's meeting.</p> <p>PC Andrew Jenkins outlined to the Committee that South Wales Police had applied for a review of the Premises Licence for the Pantyscallog Inn on the grounds that the Premises Licence Holder is not promoting the licensing objectives, namely the prevention of crime and disorder and the prevention of public nuisance.</p> <p>He outlined that there had been sporadic complaints of excessive noise and nuisance, and explained in detail the events that had occurred. As a result South Wales Police feel that the proposed conditions are necessary and appropriate to adhere to the licensing objectives.</p> <p>Mr Donnison then made representation on behalf of Mr Brewer and outlined that CCTV is already in place which covers both inside and outside the public house and has the required features outlined by the Police in their submission. He advised that it is recognised further training is required on the CCTV and Mr Brewer has been in contact with the installers to arrange appropriate training.</p> <p>Discussion also ensued in relation to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The proposed conditions by South Wales Police. • Live music at the premises recognising that the requirements had to be met to keep the noise to a manageable level. • Use of polycarbonate glasses when events are being held. • 2 SIA registered staff to be employed when re-arranged or organised functions are held and when the public house is at its full capacity. • The Police involvement/records Log. <p>Questions were raised by the Committee and were answered by the appropriate officer.</p>
