Prior to this 3 year period coming to an end the PSPO will need to be reviewed whereupon they can be renewed, varied or discharged.	No – because PSPOs can only be viewed in three year cycles – planning further ahead than that would be in breach of the enabling legislation.
Prevention - Preventing problems before they happen.	Evidence from the College of Policing who considered gating PSPOs with University College London found that the installation of the gates made the carrying out of crime and ASB simply more difficult by increasing the effort of offenders to gain access to alleys to then commit ASB or crime. Preventing problems before they happen	No
Integration - Integrating with other strategies.	This links to the Council’s Community Safety and Waste strategies and will help to reduce crime, disorder and environmental offences linked to these lanes.	No
