323	Update Report - Violence Against Women and Girls, Domestic Abuse and Sexual Violence	<p>The Chair welcomed Councillor G Thomas Cabinet Member, Nicola Mahoney and Julie Beck from Safer Merthyr Tydfil to the Meeting.</p> <p>Nicola Mahoney and Julie Beck then led the Committee in detail through the 'Update Report – Violence Against Women and Girls, Domestic Abuse and Sexual Violence' report and together with the Officers responded in detail to the questions raised by the Committee:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The impact on Service provision in Merthyr Tydfil due to lockdown • Paragraph 4.7 – MARAC Cases – What is the Benchmark figure – What are the current figures – How do Merthyr Tydfil figures compare with neighbouring Councils – Are there any factors unique to Merthyr Tydfil – Why are the figures higher than neighbour Authorities – Are the cases only Domestic Violence or do they include cases of Sexual Violence • Operation Encompass – Are the Police given the figures for this – Has the level increased • Is Domestic Violence a historic problem in Merthyr Tydfil – Is it getting worst – What measures can be put in for prevention • What interaction is there between the Social Services Team with the Safer Merthyr Tydfil Domestic Violence Team • How do Safer Merthyr Tydfil work with Partner Agencies • How prevalent is Domestic Violence in the LGBT Community • Is there research to indicate how much Domestic Violence is unknown • Is assistance provided for men – What are the engagement figures for men • The Annual Meeting that is held with the Police and the Committee • Explanation requested in relation to accessing funding and an overview of funding – Is any funding received from the Local Authority – Has funding increased in recent years • The men campaign and the low uptake figure – Is there an opportunity to feed back instances to the Police in order to bring about change • Is Domestic Violence more of a generation issue – Is it coming through to a younger generation • Does Domestic Violence run in families – If violence is seen in the household is it more likely for a household member to commit violence <p>The Chair and Councillor Thomas then stated that if there was any aspect that Safer Merthyr Tydfil wished to bring forward to refer this to the Committee.</p>
